

Offer of Scholarships by the Government of the People's Republic of China

For Study Commencing 2023

The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago invites **ONLINE** applications from citizens of Trinidad and Tobago for scholarships being offered by the Government of the People's Republic of China for the academic year commencing 2023.

A. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

Purpose of Scholarship	This scholarship is intended to strengthen mutual understanding and develop cooperation between the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (GoRTT).
Number of Scholarships	As determined by the Government of the People's Republic of China.
Areas of Study to be awarded	Postgraduate Programmes as specified in Appendix I .
Who Can Apply	Citizens of Trinidad and Tobago.
Tenability	<p>The scholarship is tenable at any of the academic institutions in the Government of the People's Republic of China approved by the CSC as listed in Appendix I.</p> <p>The scholarship is renewed annually subject to satisfactory performance as evidenced by the attainment of a Grade Point Average of 3.0 or having met the requirements of the institution for the student to be in good academic standing.</p> <p>The programme of study must be accredited and the institution of study must be recognized by the Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago (ACTT).</p>
Application Process	The prescribed application form is available at www.scholarships.moe.gov.tt for completion and submission along with all supporting documents.
Deadline date for submission	May 19, 2023 @ 4 p.m.
Response to Application	The advertisement and selection process must be completed and nominations made by the respective Governments between 60 to 90 days from the advice of the availability of the awards.
General Conditions of Scholarship	<p>Applicants should be aware of the following general conditions of the scholarship:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The GoRTT reserves the right to publish the names of candidates selected for scholarships. By applying for a scholarship, the applicant gives consent for such publication in the event that his/her application is successful.

- Recipients will be given a formal *Notification of Scholarship*, requesting that they indicate their acceptance of the scholarship.
- Formal confirmation of the scholarship will be issued when all conditions have been met.
- Scholars will be expected to take up the scholarship from the date stated by the GoRTT in its *Notification of the Scholarship*.
- Scholars will be expected to reside in the People's Republic of China throughout their scholarship and to seek prior approval for any proposed visits abroad, except for visits to Trinidad and Tobago. Expenses for such travel are not included in the scholarship.
- Scholars may not undertake paid employment during their scholarship without prior consent from the GoRTT.
- Scholarships are valid for one degree only and scholars are not eligible for completion of another degree simultaneously or continuation to another higher degree.
- Scholars must not change their programme of study during the tenure of the scholarship except with written permission from the GoRTT and/or the sponsoring agency.
- Scholars must maintain satisfactory progress reports and good standing as stipulated by the academic institution, or the scholarship will be withdrawn and the recipient liable to repay the GoRTT for the expenditure on the scholarship.
- Scholars must follow the approved programme of study and abide by the rules, regulations and codes of conduct of the academic institution. A suspension from the academic institution will result in immediate suspension of the scholarship and can lead to termination of the scholarship. Allowances are not payable during suspension.
- The Government of the People's Republic of China will require a medical report before a scholarship can be confirmed.
- Recipients of scholarships will be required to sign a *Master Scholarship Loan Agreement (MSLA)* to return to Trinidad and Tobago and report in person to the Ministry responsible for the administration of this scholarship within one (1) month of completion of the requirements for the award of the degree.
- The Government of the People's Republic of China and the GoRTT will only consider requests to extend the scholarship or grant leave to remain in China post scholarship in instances where it is absolutely necessary. **Strict conditions will apply.**
- The Ministry responsible for the administration of this scholarship will **not** provide any letter of non-objection to work in a foreign country on the completion of the programme of study.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All terms and conditions of the scholarship will be subject to local law and practices in the country of study and sponsoring country. • All regulations concerning immigration and visas are set by the Government of the People’s Republic of China and are outside of the control of the Scholarships and Advanced Training Division, the agency responsible for managing the scholarship.
Scholarship Procedure	Final award of scholarships will be made when the Cabinet approves the scholarship and the CSC advises of the selected nominees. Applicants will be notified as indicated above. The scholarship will be governed by a legally binding MSLA. A duly executed Scholarship Agreement, along with other scholarship policies, shall be the binding authority between the scholar and the GoRTT. Additional scholarship information is available on the Ministry of Education’s website, www.scholarships.moe.gov.tt . The application and award process will be managed in accordance with the policies and procedures of the Government of the People’s Republic of China.
Role of the GoRTT	The nominating Government is responsible for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Disseminating information on the scholarships; • Ensuring that all applications are completed according to requirements; • Ensuring that only qualified applicants are shortlisted; and • Nominating only the best among applicants.

B. FUNDING

The under-mentioned payments will be made by the Government of the People’s Republic of China unless otherwise stated:

Tuition
Accommodation
Book Allowance
International Airfare
Personal Allowance
Settlement Allowance
Salary Allowance (applicable to <u>Permanently Appointed Public Officers</u> only); Payment to be made by the GoRTT.

Funding will be determined by the duration of the degree programme.

C. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for this scholarship, an applicant must:

- a) (i) Be a citizen of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago and must not be a permanent resident of any other country;
- (ii) Meet the age requirement as specified by the academic institution to which he/she is applying;
- b) Have obtained a university degree **by the closing date for submission of applications** to the Ministry of Education, SATD;
- c) Be in good physical and mental health to complete the programme successfully;
- d) Be able to take up his/her scholarship as indicated by the Government of the People's Republic of China;
- e) Agree to remain in the sponsoring country for the period of time required to complete studies, if applying for an on-line programme;
- f) Possess the following:
 - (i) At least a Second Class Honours degree (Upper Division) or a minimum GPA of 3.00, if applying for a Master's degree;
 - (ii) At least a Second Class Honours (Upper Division) degree and a relevant postgraduate qualification, which will normally be a Master's degree, if applying for a PhD.

D. REQUIREMENTS

- a) All applicants are required to submit three (3) recommendations electronically as follows:
 - (i) Two (2) recommendation letters from current or former professor, supervisor, business leader, etc., stamped and/or signed which recommend the applicant for the scholarship;
 - and
 - (ii) One (1) recommendation letter from a current or previous employer stamped and/or signed. If unemployed or never employed, the applicant is requested to obtain a third recommendation from a former academic, professional or personal source.

The recommendations must attest to the applicant's ability to perform and to succeed as a scholar by providing relevant and practical examples where applicable. They must also describe what contribution the applicant will make and the likely impact the applicant will have on the institution/community/country.

Recommendations must be signed, scanned and uploaded to the application. Only scanned copies of the signed recommendations will be accepted.

(b) Applicants must:

- (i) Prepare and submit an essay, '**online**', of no more than 750 words, which includes:
 - A description of a developmental need that exists in Trinidad and Tobago;
 - A description of a programme of study that deals significantly with the need identified; and
 - A description of how exposure to the selected programme of study will equip the candidate in meeting the identified need.
- (ii) Have obtained a bachelor's degree by the time they submit their scholarship application.
- (iii) Be accepted into the university where they plan to study as indicated in **Appendix I**.

- **Persons who may have already obtained a scholarship from the Government of China or already enrolled in a Programme of Study in China are not eligible for this award; and**
- **Applicants must meet All the requirements of this scholarship to be considered eligible.**

E. SELECTION CRITERIA:

For all awards, candidates must first meet the standards set for academic merit. Those candidates will then be assessed and recommended for a scholarship based on the following:

- i. Quality and Content of Essay
 - ii. Work and Volunteer Experience
 - iii. Interview
- **Candidates must attain a minimum score of 50% at the interview in order to be considered for the nomination of a scholarship.**
 - **The GoRTT is responsible for the nomination of suitable candidates and this does not in any way guarantee selection or placement for this scholarship.**

Applicants must upload the following documents to their ‘Online’ application:

- Copies of Academic Certificates, Degrees or Diplomas
- Proof of acceptance/enrollment at an academic institution
- Copy of Birth Certificate (with affidavit where necessary)
- Copy of Proof of Change of Name (where necessary)
- Copy of relevant bio data page from valid Trinidad and Tobago Passport. If this is not available, a copy of Electoral Identification Card (back and front)
- Persons born outside of Trinidad and Tobago must provide evidence of citizenship (copy) and residency
- Applicants who are Public Officers must upload a signed letter from their Permanent Secretary/Head of Department indicating that they have no disciplinary matters pending
- Any further documents which you prepared and which provides greater insight into your research proposal

Please Note:

- All originals must be produced upon request.
- Applicants must ensure that their information on the attached/uploaded documents are legible at a zoom ratio of 100%. Applicants **must not submit documents in ‘Zip Folders’**. Each document should be uploaded in the relevant field on the upload page. Please ensure that your documents are legible by opening and checking the quality of the document before submitting your application online. Applications with documents which are illegible, cannot be verified and will therefore not be processed.
